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NT720 <u>The Passion Discourse of John</u>. An exegetical treatment of John 13-17 with emphasis on the instruction given the apostolic company for understanding the Lord's will regarding its conduct and belief in the post-ascension period. Prerequisite: NT504 or its equivalent. 3 hours. (Available for English Bible as well as the exegetical studies in Greek)

OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

- L. To increase the student's understanding of the content of this portion.
- To help the student see how the teaching of Christ in this passage prepared the church for its new life in the period after the ascension.
- 3. To aid the student in seeing what the Lord expected of His own and what He continues to expect of the church.
- 4. To help the student gain greater facility in ministering from this section of the Lord's teaching.
- 5. To assist the student in applying the ministry of Jesus to the work and life of our present churches.

METHODS USED TOWARD THE FULFILLING OF THE COURSE OBJECTIVES

- The entire portion will be carefully outlined and translated by the student (Greek option students on the translation)
- 2. The text of Carson THE FAREWELL DISCOURSE AND FINAL PRAYER OF JESUS is read as collateral reading.
- 3. The student will prepare expository message outlines for the entire passage.
- 4. Supplementary historical material is supplied by lecture and assigned reading.
- The passage is broadly discussed in class with an emphasis on what it teaches and how this teaching is fulfilled.

PROCEDURES USED TO DETERMINE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Student participation in the translation and outlining of the passage is evaluated and graded.
- 2. Students are regularly question on the work.
- 3. Message outlines are evaluated and graded.
