NT720 The Passion Discourse of John. An exegetical treatment of John 13-17 with emphasis on the instruction given the apostolic company for understanding the Lord's will regarding its conduct and belief in the post-ascension period. Prerequisite: NT504 or its equivalent. 3 hours. (Available for English Bible as well as the exegetical studies in Greek)

OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

1. To increase the student's understanding of the content of this portion.
2. To help the student see how the teaching of Christ in this passage prepared the church for its new life in the period after the ascension.
3. To aid the student in seeing what the Lord expected of His own and what He continues to expect of the church.
4. To help the student gain greater facility in ministering from this section of the Lord's teaching.
5. To assist the student in applying the ministry of Jesus to the work and life of our present churches.

METHODS USED TOWARD THE FULFILLING OF THE COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. The entire portion will be carefully outlined and translated by the student (Greek option students on the translation)
2. The text of Carson THE FAREWELL DISCOURSE AND FINAL PRAYER OF JESUS is read as collateral reading.
3. The student will prepare expository message outlines for the entire passage.
4. Supplementary historical material is supplied by lecture and assigned reading.
5. The passage is broadly discussed in class with an emphasis on what it teaches and how this teaching is fulfilled.

PROCEDURES USED TO DETERMINE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. Student participation in the translation and outlining of the passage is evaluated and graded.
2. Students are regularly questioned on the work.
3. Message outlines are evaluated and graded.
