

e. Chart Work:

Now the purpose in the chart is to get the students to study the material. There are 333 references listed and the student should have studied through all of these references, filling in and completing the chart by January 16. The class starts on December 5 and that means you have 5 class weeks to do this amount of work. If you divide it mathematically..it means you will need to do about 60 references a week. Make that a goal and that is how we will kind of trudge along in class.

We will discuss week by week some of the citations and you will be able to get a feeling of how your work goes in comparison with other students. But we have a number of other class items to work with it so we will not look at every one.

Now..my experience was that this was best done with two Bibles...one in which I kept a note on the O.T. reference and the other of which I kept open only to the New Testament. If you are working with Greek and/or Hebrew, the needed Testament for that field is also handy to have. But with two Bible you reduce page turning and wear and tear. If you have a computer Bible...that is also helpful although on many programs you can only see one text at a time and it is hard to compare them that way.

2. Data Analysis Chart of Allusion Material

a. Defining the idea

Probably an illustration will serve us best. We will work in John 3...

--Read the text

--Do you see any quotations?

--Do you see any specific allusions?

--Do you see any suggestive allusions?

An allusion, of course, is a reference without detailed specification. You may be surprised at how many of them there are in the New Testament and how they are used.

b. But you must make this chart yourself..or almost by yourself.

You should have the representative first page...

and on it you will see SIX columns represented. Note these:

COLUMN I is again a column of enumeration..the numbering of the allusions as you come to them in the New Testament

COLUMN II contains the New Testament references...we are now working from it and going back to the Old Testament. And these references are not supplied by me..but will be supplied by you!
